Preparatory phase until December 2006

October 2003: Project idea developed between Nenets Association "Yasavey" and Norwegian Polar Institute (NPI)

January 2004: First funding application to Norwegian Barents Secretariat: The project was considered interesting, but no funding was available

2004: Inquiries at the Norw. Dep. of Foreign Affairs and the Nordic Council of Ministers were not successful. WWF promised a minor contribution if a main sponsor could be found

2005: The project was adjusted to IPY requirements

January 2005: Expression of Intent was submitted to the IPY Joint Committee

June 2005: Draft Preparation Form was submitted to the IPY Joint Committee

June 2005: The project leader and the President of Yasavey met for discussions

Summer/autumn 2005: Preliminary map data compilation

November 2005: Project endorsed by IPY Joint Committee

November 2005: The Norwegian Barents Secretariat financed trip for two board members from NPI to Naryan-Mar and Moscow – project planning (the project report is not posted on the Internet, but is available on request)

June 2006: The National Norw. IPY Committee accepts the project for funding

November 2006: Funding (1.2 mill. NOK) is finally granted by the Research Council of Norway

Funding transfer to Yasavey

Project website

Meetings and seminars

Implementary meeting 14-16 January 2007

The Norwegian participants (Project leader: Winfried Dallmann; GIS expert: Boele Kuipers; project assistant and interpreter: Zoia Vylka Ravna) visited the Association of Nenets People Yasavey (President: Vladislav Peskov; Executive Director: Galina Platova; Director of Yasavey Manzara: Aleksandr Belugin, and others). Besides Board meetings and meetings with the staff of Yasavey, meetings were held with representatives of the Okrug Administration, the Reindeer Husbandry Office, and the Nenets Information and Analytical Centre. Policies and procedures of cooperation were discussed. Olga Murashko form RAIPON, Moscow, joined the meetings and prepared for the questionnaire campaign among the local population, of which she will be in charge.

It is noteworthy that the new (since summer, 2006) administration does not want to support the part of the project that gathers information on oil development.

Seminar for questionnaire campaign in Naryan-Mar, 3-7 September 2007

From 3 to 7 September a project seminar was held in Naryan-Mar. Aim of the seminar was to gather representatives from a number of villages in the Nenets Autonomous Okrug who are going to carry out a questionnaire campaign with their co-villagers. Seminar leader was Olga Murashko, the project's expert on anthropology. The representatives were taught basics about traditional knowledge and juridical aspects of indigenous peoples' issues, and about the present project. Then, the questionnaires were discussed in detail, with instructions and exercises to fill in and draw information on maps. A report is posted on the website.

Seminar for questionnaire campaign in Naryan-Mar, 22-23 December 2007

A second project seminar was carried out in Naryan-Mar. The aim was to gather the the representatives from villages who carry out interviews and continue interview training on the basis of the experiences from the interviews gathered so far. A report is posted on the website.

Apart from these meetings, two telephone conferences were held.

Data acquisition

Questionnaire campaign

A major source of data for the project is questionnaire campaign directed towards traditional land users. A questionnaire has been elaborated by the project's anthropologist, Olga Murashko, and has been going on since September 2007. Local residents are contracted and trained to run the interviews in the various settlements and during various gatherings. By the end of 2007 a number of 46 interviews have been carried out, of which 40 are followed by detailed notes on maps. A

number of ca. 100 interviews is envisaged by March 2008. A sample map is posted on the website, while the othrs will be interpreted and redrawn before published and entered into the database.

Satellite image interpretation

Satelllite image interpretation at a detailed scale is used to monitor visual, physical damage of the tundra. GoogleEarth (http://earth.google.com/) provides high-resolution images for a few areas within the Nenets Autonomous Okrug. The areas around Naryan-Mar and Varandey have been interpreted on the basis of these. We are going to purchase images covering the remaning areas of interest in collaboration with the EALÁT project (http://www.ip-ipy.org/). Satellite image interpretation is done by the Norwegian Polar Institute. A sample map (Varandey area) is posted on the website.

Statistical and published data

Published or publically available data on infrastructure, population, traditional and other economies are collected by various project staff and are continually enetered into the GIS database. Data are posted on the website as tables.

GIS database

The GIS database has been provisionally established at NPI, but is not yet available to others. Data are continually entered and can be provided to project participants and cooperation partners on request. Some datasets will be posted on the website shortly.

Budget

Out of the NOK 1.200.000 provided by the Norwegian Research Council, NOK 495.000 were used by the end of 2007. An application of additional NOK 300.000 has been sent to StatoilHydro; no answer has been received yet.
